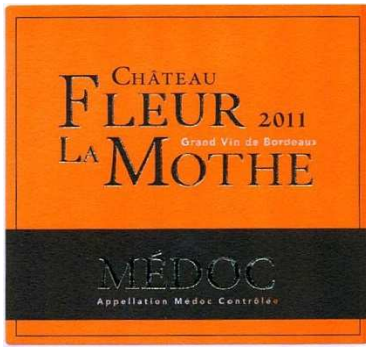


Château Fleur la Mothe 2011 ~ Médoc

Tasted at the Cru Bourgeois tasting in London. The first word that comes into my head tasting this wine is... "class". It has a beautifully defined, fresh and vibrant bouquet with pure dark cherry and wild strawberry scents that are seamlessly integrated with the oak, raspberry fruit and a velvety finish. Superb! Despite its garish orange label, this is a very good wine. Fruity, medium-bodied and purely made, it exhibits a dense ruby/purple color, fleshy fruit and soft tannins. It is ideal for drinking over the next 2-3 years.

Engaging, with a juicy, pebbly feel along the edges and a friendly core of steeped plum, anise and blackberry fruit. A light brambly shading shows on the finish. Drink now through 2015. 10,000 cases made. -JM



Tasted 100% blind by two best sommeliers of the world Andreas Larsson & Markus del Monego

AL: dark inky color. Very fine nose with a good integration of oak, vanilla, spices, dark berries and cassis, no green notes. The palate shows a fine combination of ripe dark fruit and freshness, the tannins are fairly supple and integrated. Nice wood and a long smooth finish. **90**

MDM: dark purple red with violet hue and almost black center. Opulent nose with smoky notes, hints of toasted oak, dark berry fruit, blackcurrant and blackberries, discreet spiciness. On the palate well structured with medium weight but rather good length and quite mature fruit. **90**

Smoky wood aromas are confirmed on the palate by a tough, wood-laden character. It's all spice and toast, leaving little room at this stage for fruit. That should come because the wine has weight and suggestions of rich berry fruits in the background. — R.V. (5/1/2014)

Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon. Deep black cherry colour. Spicy with a touch of eucalyptus over the ripe cassis – attractive fragrance. Not a great deal of fruit depth but the tannins have been handled well so as to remain in balance with the relatively light body. Surprisingly long. A little dusty and dry on the finish. Drink 2015-2020. *Julia Harding*
